### **CHAPTER III**

#### RESEARCH METHODS

The research method can be interpreted as a process, principles and procedures used to solve a problem of a research. In completing this study the authors using the following research method:

# A. Type of Research

The type of this research is a Normative Legal Research. Normative legal Research is a research which uses the law as foundation of norm. This means that this research is based on the library research focusing on reading and analyzing of the primary and secondary materials.

# B. Type of Approach
