Indonesia At the 20th Melanesian Spearhead Group  
Leaders' Summit Honiara, Solomon Islands, 26 June 2015**

It will also open greater access to the "253 million Indonesians" potential partner and market.

Indonesia can also be a gateway to enter the greater ASEAN market, a robust market of 600 million people....a number equivalent to 9 % of the world's population.

Our commitment for MSG is real and concrete.

We want to support our fellow MSG Members to have a stronger engagement with the wider international community.

We will grow together through the exploration of new opportunities. That is why we have encouraged the active participation of our MSG fellows in APEC 2013 as well as in the Asia-Africa Conference 2015.

### **DEVELOPING TOGETHER**

As an archipelagic country, as with most Pacific countries, we are confronted with common challenges.

Challenges of natural disasters... Challenges of climate change...

And challenges to enhance economic welfare.

These are eminent challenges that we must address together. These are challenges that calls for a joint effort to develop together.

In a nutshell, developing together implies strengthening our committment to work closer with our brothers and sisters in the MSG...both bilaterally and multilaterally.

Indonesia remains committed to assist our MSG brothers and sisters during dire times.

Indonesia has been present and have assisted countries such as Vanuatu in post Typhoon Pam recovery.

As a country with similar geographical and cultural background, there are plentiful avenues to expand cultural exchanges and cooperation. One alternative is through the convening of cultural events.

In October 2015, the East Nusa Tenggara Province will be hosting the Melanesian Cultural Festival. We would be most grateful if MSG Members can join and contribute to this event.

I have full confidence that we could quadruple the two-way trade of USD 260 million in the coming years.

The provision of technical cooperation may help in the attainment of a better economic stature.

In this spirit, Indonesia remains steadfast in providing technical cooperation through capacity building programs in the area of fisheries product processing, handicraft making, arts and culture, diplomatic courses, journalism and human resources development.

To this day, we have convened no less than 130 technical cooperation programs, involving 583 participants from the Pacific countries.

Our private sectors and SMEs have also contributed in these programs. However, we realize that there are still many

untapped potentials that can be further explored in future times.

There is much to be done.
