CHAPTER II

GENERAL OBJECT DESCRIPTION

2.1 Overview of Government Science Study Program Profile

University of Muhammadiyah Malang (UMM) is an "A" accredited private university with SK Number: 074 / SK / BAN-PT / Ak-IV / PT / II / 2013, which is centered on the integrated campus III of the University of Muhammadiyah Malang, Jalan Raya Tlogomas 246 Malang City, East Java. UMM was founded in 1964 as part of a Muhammadiyah organization and the largest Muhammadiyah college in East Java which has the motto "Dari Muhammadiyah Untuk Bangsa."

At present, the University of Muhammadiyah Malang (UMM) occupies 3 campus locations, namely Campus I on Jalan Bandung 1, Campus II on Jalan Bendungan Sutami 188 A and Campus III on Jalan Raya Tlogomas 246. Campus I was the beginning of UMM establishment and is now used for the Postgraduate program. Whereas Campus II, which used to function as a primary activity center, is now turned into a campus of the Faculty of Medicine and the Faculty of Health Sciences. Meanwhile, Campus III now as a campus is the center of all activities.

In realizing as The Real University, based on the Directorate of Higher Education, UMM has a teaching staff of 615 people with an educational qualification of nearly 80% of S2 graduates, 15% of S3 and professors meanwhile the rest are still graduates of S1 from various domestic and foreign universities. In addition, UMM was also supported by hundreds of administrative staff, technicians, and laboratory assistants who are experts in their fields.

At its inception, UMM opened several faculties, namely the Faculty of Social and Political Sciences (FISIP), Law Faculty, Economics Faculty, and the Faculty of Teacher Training and Education (FKIP) as well as the Department of Religious Sciences (Branch of FAI Universitas Muhammadiyah Jakarta). As time goes by and the demands of the times, UMM opened other faculties, namely the Faculty of Engineering, the Faculty of Agriculture-Animal Husbandry, the Faculty of Psychology, the Faculty of Medicine, the Faculty of Health Sciences, and the Post-Graduate Program with several majors. Now UMM has 3 Diploma III Programs, 10 Faculties consisting of 35 Undergraduate Study Programs, 9 Masters Programs, 3 Doctoral Programs, and 7 Professional Education Programs.

The Faculty of Social and Political Sciences consists of 5 Study Programs namely, Social Welfare Sciences (KESOS) (accredited A), Communication Studies (IK) (accredited A), Government Science (IP) (accredited A), Sociology (accredited A), and International Relations (HI) (accredited A).

Government Science Program on Universitas Muhammadiyah Malang has a Government Science Laboratory supporting system and a library as a Resource Center, internalization of academic values, and the strengthening of government practices and supported by modern facilities, IT-based academic administration, and competent teaching staff. The Government Science Study Program has established an institutional collaboration and Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) to all stakeholders and shareholders in the form of a research apprenticeship program and student service to the community. The collaboration has been established with various government agencies both at central and regional levels,

foreign universities, private parties, non-governmental organizations (NGOs), and civil society as a real manifestation of strengthening the values of good governance. In addition, the Government Science Study Program also provides various soft skills to students as a form of facilitating the development of leadership in the Government Student Science Association (HIMAP), strengthening English language skills in the Government English Club (GEC) and strengthening scientific writing skills at Research Lovers Institutions, and Writing Governmental Science (PERS-IP). Since 1986 Government Science has produced graduates who have been absorbed in various kinds of central and regional government institutions, Educational Institutions, Mass Media, Financial Institutions, Political Parties (politicians), NGOs, and various other institutions.

The Government Study Program was established in 1986 with a Decree of the Minister of Education and Culture of the Republic of Indonesia Number 0502 / O / 1516. Initially, the Government Study Program accommodated alumni of the Academy of Domestic Administration (APDN-Malang) who wanted to obtain a bachelor's degree. Therefore the Government Study Program was initially directed to fill positions that exist within the scope of government. The Government Science Study Program equips students with comprehensive science and skills in the field of governance.

In its development, the Government Study Program is not only directed at providing scholars who will fill government positions but is open to positions outside government, such as in the political world (political parties), NGOs (Non-

governmental organizations, private companies) and in the world of journalism as a journalist.

The development of political life and post-reform government marked by the increasing role of political parties on all fronts allowed political parties to grow and develop in almost all corners of the country, even in the villages. In addition, the implementation of decentralization and regional autonomy has provided opportunities for each region to regulate and organize their own government in accordance with the initiatives and aspirations of the local community. Therefore, each region will increasingly need human resources which are not only skilled, but also have a good character, and are supported with high scientific capacity and quality in the field of politics and regional government.
