
















EXERCISE

Rainbows are often seen when the sun comes out after or during a cainstorm. Rainbows are caused when sunlight shines through drops of water in the sky at a specific angle. Then white sunlight enters a raindrops, it exits the raindrop a different color. When light exits lots of different raindrops at different angles, it produces the red, orange, yellow, green, about indigo, and violet that you see in a rainbow. Together, these colors are known as the spectrum. These colors can sometimes be seen in waterfalls and fountain as well.

Did you know that there are double rainbow? In a double rainbow, light reflocts twice inside water droplets and form two arcs. In next double sainbows, the colors of the top arc are opposite from those in the bottom and in other words, the order of colons starts with purple on top and ends with the red of bottom. Believe it or not, nainbows sometimes appear as write arcs at night. These rainbows are called monthows. Monthows are caused by moosity's (rather than sunlight) shining though drops of water.







- Try to anticipate how the answer will appear and what clues you might use to help you locate the answer. For example, if you were looking for a certain date, you would quickly read the paragraph looking only for numbers.
- Use headings and any other aids that will help you identify which sections might contain the information you are looking for.
- Selectively read and skip through sections of the passage.



- 6. Finally, bake in the preheated oven for 8-10 minutes or until the crumbs are brown and firm.


