

CHAPTER FIVE

CONCLUSION AND RECOMMENDATION

A. Conclusion

The international covenants protect human rights for the suspect of terrorism through ICCPR and CAT which clearly relate and mentions in their article. For instance, ICCPR mentions that no one shall be subjected to the torture or to cruel, arbitrary detention, inhuman or degrading treatment or punishment in any criminal offences. In line with ICCPR, another convention called as CAT also deals with the protection of human rights for the suspect of terrorist such as in the articles 1, 2, 10, 11, 12, 13 and 16 which states that CAT is the convention which deals to the prohibitions of torture and other cruel, inhuman or degrading treatment. The parties to the convention are obliged to protect their community from torture.

B. Recommendation

Based on the problem facing by the government from previous discussion, the author would like give a suggestion as follows: first, strengthening the effective control of police (Densus 88) on the process of countering terrorism. Second, the Densus 88 needs to have a clear accountability if they commit violation of human rights to the suspect of terrorism.
